



## OMA reports a 22.0% increase in August 2023 passenger traffic

**Mexico City, Mexico, September 6, 2023**—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 22.0% in August 2023, as compared to August 2022. Domestic traffic increased 21.6%, and international traffic increased 25.5%.
