



OMA reports a 0.6% increase in January 2024 passenger traffic

Mexico City, Mexico, February 7, 2024—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 0.6% in January 2024, as compared to January 2023. Domestic traffic decreased -0.6%, and international traffic increased 7.7%. During January, Acapulco Airport operated in a regular manner, the figures reflect the impact of Hurricane Otis on the destination. Excluding Acapulco Airport, terminal passenger traffic in its remaining 12 airports increased 3.4% during January 2024, as compared to January 2023.
